Thanks to one of the generous gifts we received during Pastor Appreciation Month my family recently made our way to the Romeo Theater. We were all excited to see *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever*. The book has been a favorite of our family and is well worth the read for people of all ages. I also promise I am not going to spoil the story here so you can keep reading. However, upon listening to the audio book a few weeks ago, and then seeing the movie, I realized why they both had made such an impact on me.

We are of course approaching the Advent season. The time we set aside to prepare for Christmas. For many of us I'm sure it will include many traditions. Decorations will come out of storage. Gatherings of family and friends will be scheduled. A Christmas Pageant will happen at the Church (December 22nd if you don't have it on your calendar!) And there are probably many other traditions in your own families. I don't think any of that is necessarily a bad thing. I think it is important to enjoy those things that we look forward to in the Advent season. To attend those gatherings that bring us together and celebrate the joy of the season. But my recent viewing of *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever* reminded me that not everyone has those traditions that they look forward to.

For some this time of year can be difficult. It can be a reminder of things lost, things they don't have, or things they wish they did have. Let's face it, for all the good and beautiful and joyful things we have in our world the very real fact remains that there is fear, uncertainty, and difficulties for many. And on that cold night many, many years ago things weren't perfect and cozy either.

We like our Nativity stories to be pleasant and warm. We like to see Mary lovingly gazing at Jesus lying quietly in the manger while Joseph looks on. But in reality, Mary and Joseph found themselves in a difficult place. Even as they had been told they were welcoming God's son into the world they were dealing with their own uncertainties and fears. 


#### Nativity Play

#### Did you know -

John Wesley was a prolific writer, but he never published a Christmas sermon. If you search for Christmas sermons by John Wesley, you won't find any. John Wesley's Methodist movement began in England during the 200 years of Puritans and Christmas suppression. As a result, there is no evidence they celebrated Christmas other than with a special worship service.

Some speculate the Methodist preachers may have chosen to begin the founding conference of The Methodist Episcopal Church on Christmas Eve 1784 because they were all available. Methodists would later refer to that gathering as the Christmas Conference.

It wasn't until the mid-1800s that Christmas had a resurgence in England. It was not until 1870 that Christmas became a national holiday in the U.S. (*umc.org*)
