

Pastor's Paragraphs

^{10b} Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." ¹¹ When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.

--Luke 5:10b-11

As I sit and write this the outdoor temperature is hovering right around 4 degrees. The forecast of the next few days promises to see that number drop even lower, including into the negative number range. On days such as these my first instinct is to want to do absolutely nothing. The warmest, fuzziest sweatpants and sweatshirt, maybe a pot of chili on the stove, a blanket & book are all needed, and under no circumstance do I want to open the door for any reason! That would certainly be my ideal way to spend these frigid days when they come around.

I actually laughed out loud when I was preparing this article and read the selection of Scripture from Luke 5 with Jesus and the fisherman. I envisioned Jesus doing this miracle in the middle of February on a northern Michigan lake. It wouldn't have involved a boat at all, but rather maybe Jesus would have made a hole appear in the ice and had the fish jumping out of that hole and into the Disciples fishing shanty. But then I remembered what might be the most important part of the story.

Jesus didn't just walk up to the Disciples and shake his fist in the air and make fish appear in their nets. Rather, as he approached the seashore we are told that those would be Disciples were cleaning their nets. After a long night of fishing and coming up empty handed they were probably in a pretty sour mood, dejected over the fact they had nothing to sell to the market that morning. But here is the key, as Jesus approached them what did he say? Jesus told them, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." I am certain that was about the last thing they wanted to do. They were done, fried from a night's work that had left them with nothing to show for it. And after voicing this concern to Jesus, Simon Peter delivers the first of many statements that are lessons for all of us, "Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets."

Throughout our lives there are going to be plenty of times we don't want to do something. Be it because of the weather, or we are tired, or it is too hard, or we aren't good at that. If we want, we can always find a reason not to do the thing we know we should be doing. And that thing, our mission, our marching orders that came from Jesus is the same thing he told the Disciples after that miraculous catch, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people."

Our work in the church doesn't stop when the weather turns cold and we would rather hunker down. It doesn't stop as things thaw out and the flowers start budding and vacations are calling to us. Our calling exists in any and all times and places that we find ourselves. My hope for all of us as we trudge through these cold wintry months is that we do not lose sight of our mission and purpose. That we continue to go fishing (even if it is through the ice!), that we continue to look for opportunities to serve and share the Good News of Jesus Christ.
