# Pastor's Paragraphs

<sup>28</sup> "Come to me, all you who are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. <sup>29</sup> Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. <sup>30</sup> For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

--Matthew 11:28-30

According to Merriam-Webster the definition of 'Weary' is:

- 1. exhausted in strength, endurance, vigor, or freshness
- 2. expressing or characteristic of weariness
- 3. having one's patience, tolerance, or pleasure exhausted

I'm not going to lie, that seems like a pretty apt description of my state of being coming out of the month of February. I don't know if it was the cold temperatures, the seemingly daily snowfall, or the illnesses running amok, but February took its toll on me. It has left me feeling exhausted of strength, endurance, vigor, and freshness.

Yet even as I was feeling tired and drained I received a message. A good friend from my previous church informed me of his Dad's unexpected passing. He then said that his Mom would like for me to be involved in the funeral, she would like for me to do the message and eulogy. It was of course an honor to be asked, it is always an honor to be entrusted to do such sacred work such as celebrating and remembering a loved one. But as I got the details my head spun a little bit. I was already feeling that weariness I spoke of above, and the illness that had gained a foothold in our house wasn't slowing down any. I truly found myself wondering how I was going to put together a message that would honor the one we were celebrating and speak to the hope we have of resurrection through Jesus Christ.

I continued to carry those doubts and fears until the very day of the memorial service. It wasn't until I had put the car in park in the lot of the church that I asked God to step in. I didn't think I had the strength to be what the family needed and I asked God to take control.

Several hours later I was sitting at a table at the restaurant where they were holding the meal. I felt a hand on my back and turned to see the widow of the man we were gathered to celebrate. With tears in her eyes she told me, thank you, she told me how much she had appreciated the service and that it was a wonderful way to pay tribute to the legacy her husband created and had now left behind.

I cannot tell you the specific words that were said, I cannot begin to take credit for anything that happened in the church during that service. But I do understand what it means to turn to our Lord when we are weary and carrying heavy burdens. I KNOW beyond a shadow of a doubt that in those moments, when we ask, the Holy Spirit shows up to provide just what we need.

If you are having those weary feelings know that you are not alone. Know also that Jesus Christ's offer is just as fresh today as it was all those years before. I leave you with a reminder, with a word of encouragement from Paul's letter to the Galatian church: "So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up." (Galatians 6:9)
